The lecture will cover the challenges of designing, implementing and monitoring the effect of climate policies - both internationally and within national jurisdictions. In particular it will cover issues related to subsidy programs and offsets.

about Prof. Jaccard

Mark has been professor in the School of Resource and Environmental Management at Simon Fraser University, Vancouver, since 1986 – interrupted from 1992-97 while he served as Chair and CEO of the British Columbia Utilities Commission.

His PhD is from the Energy Economics and Policy Institute at the University of Grenoble. Internationally, Mark has been involved in the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (currently, special report on renewables), the China Council for International Cooperation on Environment and Development (2009-10, co-chair of task force on sustainable use of coal), and the Global Energy Assessment (convening lead author for sustainable energy policy). Mark's research and applied focus is on the design and application of energy-economy models, especially for assessing the cost and effectiveness of climate policies.

Prof. Jaccard is visiting CEU as an Erasmus Mundus scholar supported by the European Commission through the Erasmus Mundus Masters Course in Environmental Sciences, Policy and Management (MESPOM)
